Remuneration of key management personnel

Promotion, marketing or sponsorship expenditure includes design, production and distribution of Fund promotional or educational materials, advertising development and media costs, sponsorships and alliance partnership arrangements. These expenditures are necessary to grow and maintain the fund, through regular and relevant communication with members.

Political donations

A political donation is a gift made to, or for the benefit of, a political party, elected member, candidate, group of candidates, or other person or entity including an associated entity.

IIML does not make political donations.

Industrial body payments

Industrial bodies are defined in legislation as organisations registered under the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.

Payments to industrial bodies includes partnership arrangements – which may include advertising, marketing and education services.

IIML does not make payments to Industrial bodies.

Related party payments

Related party payments occur when payments are made by the super fund to a connected entity of the trustee of the fund which provides services to us.

Payments include – investment management costs, promotional and marketing services, payments to key management personnel (including the trustee or executive of the trustee of the fund), Board committee fees, insurance services, financial planning, arrears collection and other member services.
